Indiana Weather

As you know, predicting weather in Indiana can be tricky, especially in the early winter months. When inclement weather threatens. understand a team of individuals under the leadership of our Transportation Director, Mr. Greg Hopkins, kick in to action to determine road conditions, parking lot and driveway conditions, and the safety factor for parents and students traveling to and on our school campus. This team includes local law enforcement officials, county transportation individuals, school officials, National Weather Service personnel, and surrounding school corporation individuals to determine conditions they are experiencing and move-

ment of storms into the East Washington school district boundaries. When schools are closed, a message is sent via School Messenger to alert parents and students of a school closure. Television and radio stations are notified, and social media is used to get the word into the community. Every effort is made to announce closures before 6 AM with the goal always being SAFETY FIRST for students. Parents and guardians can ensure they receive messages by updating their contact information by notifying the school or updating their Harmony account on line through the corporation website.

I also want to remind you

that great things continue to happen at East Washington School Corporation! At East Washington, we are on track for a continued school year of best-ever experiences for students. We certainly understand that parents and families are the child's first and most influential teachers. Parents and families are our partners they share the school district's commitment to excellence in education for their children. Recognition of ISTEP+ Students

The Board of Trustees of the East Washington School Corporation has recognized 18 students from East Washington Elementary who scored Pass + on the spring 2015 ISTEP Test.

Twelve students from last year's third grade and six students were from last year's fourth grade were recognized at the December board meeting. These students scored Pass + in both English/Language Arts and Math.

Scoring Pass + is the highest distinction to be made on this assessment. The format of the test changed this year. The questions were matched with the Indiana Academic Standards. These standards are part of the Career and College Readiness movement and are much more rigorous than in ISTEP's of years past.
